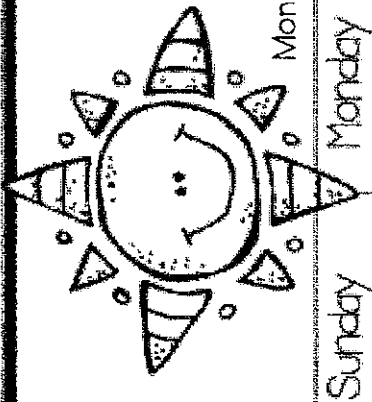

During the summer months, please complete the following:

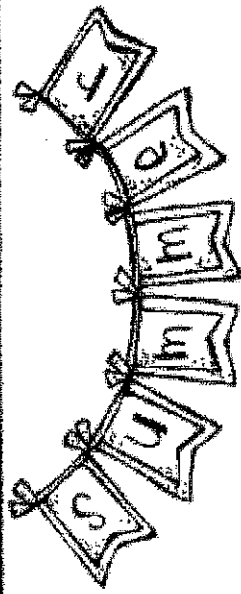
- * The activity assigned to each day on your calendar— you are welcome to go back to previously completed activities and redo them for extra practice.
